### **Suspense**

Please refer to our TAIPA bulletin number 49, copy attached. In follow-up to this bulletin, we wish to advise all companies that at the direction of the Governing Committee, TAIPA is extending the time period for suspension of rules regarding the assignment of applications.

TAIPA will continue to contact the producer for pertinent information on the application form and correct premium; however, if this information is not received within twenty (20) days TAIPA will assign the application as submitted.

If the premium is not received from the producer within twenty (20) days of date of our request the application will be assigned without premium included.

In the event an insurer does not receive a premium payment with an application, normal termination procedures should be followed.

**TAIPA Bulletin No. 49**

**To All Member Companies:**

Effective 1/1/97, the Commissioner of Insurance has approved a ninety (90) day suspension of the provisions of Section 6.A.5 of the Texas Auto Insurance Plan Association "Plan Of Operation."

In order to obtain the information required in order to assign an application TAIPA will contact the producer and insured requesting same. However, if this information is not received in the TAIPA office within 20 days of our request, the incomplete application will be assigned to an insurer.

During this ninety (90) day period, TAIPA will also assign those applications received with an insufficient deposit premium amount. If the deposit submitted with the application is insufficient, the insurer may bill for the deficiency immediately.
