This bulletin serves as a follow-up to the Texas Automobile Insurance Plan Association (TAIPA) bulletin 49 dated January 3, 1997, regarding Section 6.A.5 (copy attached).

The temporary application processing method implemented on January 1, 1997, will be extended until May of 1997.

TAIPA staff must provide a complete report on the procedure to the Governing Committee at its May, 22, 1997, meeting. We need information stating how our procedure has influenced the insurer's method of processing the new assignments. The temporary procedures allowed a minimal number applications to be assigned with missing or incomplete information. Applications submitted with premium remittance less than that required in Section 5 were also assigned and forwarded to the insurer for policy issuance.

TAIPA Bulletin No. 49

To All Member Companies:

Effective 1/1/97, the Commissioner of Insurance has approved a ninety (90) day suspension of the provisions of Section 6.A.5 of the Texas Auto Insurance Plan Association "Plan Of Operation."

In order to obtain the information required in order to assign an application TAIPA will contact the producer and insured requesting same. However, if this information is not received in the TAIPA office within 20 days of our request, the incomplete application will be assigned to an insurer.

During this ninety (90) day period, TAIPA will also assign those applications received with an insufficient deposit premium amount. If the deposit submitted with the application is insufficient, the insurer may bill for the deficiency immediately.
